

HIPAA Civil Penalties

<u>State Attorneys General</u>: State AGs may bring a civil action. Damages may be up to \$25,000 for all violations of an identical requirement, per calendar year. As with the penalties brought by HHS, these penalties can be separately imposed for violations of different HIPAA provisions.

HIPAA Criminal Penalties

HHS' Office for Civil Rights refers violations of the criminal provisions of HIPAA to the Department of Justice for investigation and enforcement. Penalties are as follows:

1	For knowingly and in violation of HIPAA: (a) using or causing	-Up to \$50,000
	to be used a unique health identifier, (b) obtaining individually	-Up to 1 year imprisonment

	disclosing such information to another person.	
2	If the offense is committed under false pretenses	-Up to \$100,000
		-Up to 5 years imprisonment
		-Or both
3	If committed with intent to sell, transfer, or use the information	-Up to \$250,000
	for commercial advantage, personal gain, or malicious harm	-Up to 10 years imprisonment
		-Or both

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¹ This is the maximum penalty for multiple violations of a single HIPAA provision; these penalties can be separately imposed for violations of different HIPAA provisions.
