# Transforming Healthcare Through Innovation and Collaboration: Privacy and Security

State of Play: In June, a bipartisan, bicameral coalition introduced H.R. 8152, the American Data Privacy and Protection Act (ADPPA). This bill would establish a nationwide privacy framework and expand privacy protections to health data not currently governed by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) has also begun the process of rulemaking to regulate certain forms of commercial surveillance. Federal agencies are continuing to examine further reporting of cybersecurity incidents. In September, the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) issued a request for information on implementation of breach reporting legislation that was included in legislation earlier this year. The Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) at the White House has also released its Blueprint for an AI Bill of Rights to ensure that use of algorithmic tools does not lead to discriminatory outcomes.

Confidentiality Coalition Position: The Healthcare Leadership Council (HLC) leads a broad group of organizations, collectively known as the Confidentiality Coalition, to ensure that policymakers strike the right balance between the protection of confidential health information and the information-sharing needed to provide high quality care. The coalition is active with Congress and the administration on policies related to data exchange, privacy, data security, and cybersecurity. Members believe that regulatory clarity is key to enabling health information flow and support efforts to create a uniform national privacy standard that does not conflict with the HIPAA privacy rule. The coalition also supports efforts to strengthen cybersecurity protections and advocates for federal cybersecurity policies that are focused on education and support.
